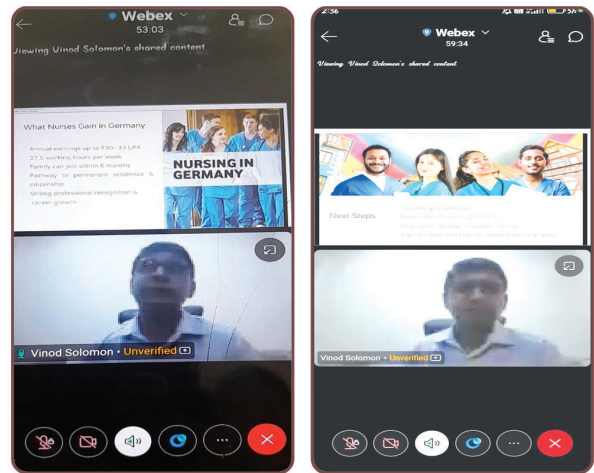


## DEVELOPMENTAL ACTIVITIES

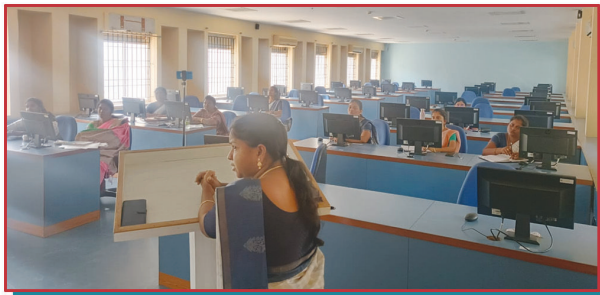
#### 2.COMPREHENSIVE PAEDIATRIC CARE PROGRAMME

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### NSS ACTIVITIES

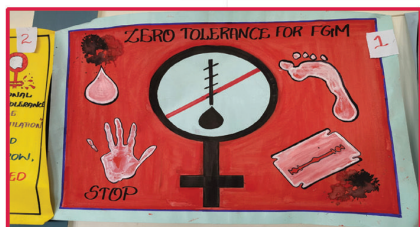
#### 1. AWARENES S PROGRAMME ON THE KAVALAR UDHAVI APP

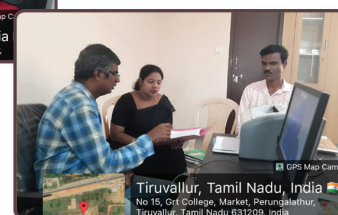




## ISO 21001

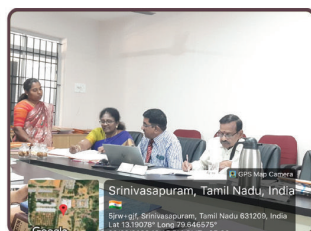
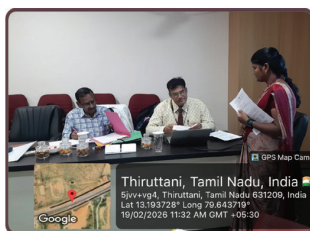
### 1. GENERAL REVIEW MEETING

The ISO 21001 Committee of GRT College of Nursing conducted a General Review Meeting on 11.02.2026 at the IQAC Room for eight faculty members. EOMS coordinators and core team members from Administration, HRM, Evaluation, Library, Placement, Student Counselling, Parent-Teacher Meeting, and Maintenance participated. ISO Consultants Mr. Motilal and Mr. Kalaiselvan led discussions on Functional Procedure Corrections, Objective Monitoring Charts, Risk Analysis, and Process Performance. The review assessed departmental compliance, identified improvement areas, and strengthened implementation of the ISO 21001 Educational Organization Management System. The committee also planned preparations for the Stage II External Audit to ensure successful certification and continuous quality improvement.



### 2. ISO 21001:2018 STAGE II EXTERNAL AUDIT

The ISO 21001 Committee of GRT College of Nursing successfully conducted the ISO 21001:2018 Stage II External Audit on 19 and 20.02.2026 at the IQAC Room with the audit team from TUV SUD South Asia, led by Mr. Prakesh Ganesan (Lead Auditor), Dr. Chandrasekhar (Technical Expert), and Dr. Sankaran Mohan (Senior Lead Auditor). The opening meeting clearly outlined the audit scope and objectives, setting a constructive tone. 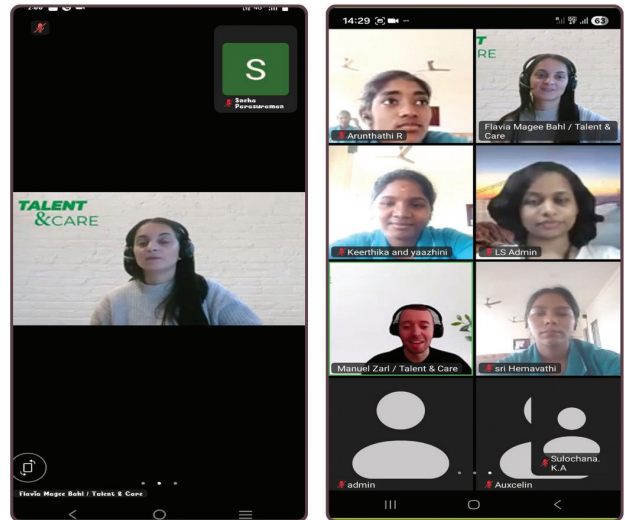




## GERMAN CLUB

### 1. GERMANY NURSING PATHWAYS

The Stage II Interview was conducted at GRT College of Nursing from 21.02.2026 to 27.02.2026 for 27 final-year B.Sc. Nursing students.
